Council President English led the flag salute and the Clerk read the prayer.



ORDINANCE 2024-23

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 12.12.070 "PAID BEACHES" OF TITLE 12 OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM ENTITLED "BEACH AND BAY AREA USE REGULATIONS" SO AS TO REVISE SEASONAL BEACH BADGE FEES

BE IT ORDAINED, by the governing body of the Borough of Ship Bottom, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Paragraph 4 of Subsection 12.12.070(E) of the Borough Code of the Borough of Ship Bottom entitled "Beach Fees" is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows:

4. \$40 per person, per season, provided that application is made to the proper authorities prior to June 1.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect after public reading and publication as required by law.

Councilman English opened the floor for public comment.




With no one further wishing to speak, Councilman Hartman made a motion to close the public portion, seconded by Councilman Butkus. All were in favor and the floor for comment was closed.
